Employment Matters

Action focuses on working with visually impaired people to help them find the right job or to retain employment following sight loss. We also provide advice, support and training to employers on the best way to recruit and support blind and partially sighted people.

Roof over your head

Everyone wants to live where they feel comfortable and safe. Our housing support service is designed to help visually impaired people live in the home of their choice, as independently as possible.

Applying for benefits

Information Technology

Mobile Sight Loss Information Service

Covering some 30,000 miles a year, our Mobile Sight Loss Information Service travels the UK, offering free impartial advice and information on the latest aids to daily life.
